SECTION I - INVITATION TO BID

- 1.1 Sealed bids for the Materials and Work necessary for completion of **Bid for Replacing the Auto Body Spray Booth** at the work location(s) listed will be received at the Erie County Technical School, 8500 Oliver Road, Erie, PA 16509.
- 1.2 All Proposals shall be submitted in sealed envelopes and marked "**Bid for Replacing the Auto Body Spray Booth**".
- 1.3 All Bids received up to **Friday, April 3, 2026, at 2:00 P.M.** and will be opened at that time.
- 1.4 The Erie County Technical School Board reserves the right to accept or reject any or all Bids and further reserves the right to waive any Bid conditions or formalities when it appears to be in its best interest to do so.
- 1.5 No Bids will be accepted as valid unless "Bid Forms" provided to all CONTRACTORS are properly and completely executed. Late Bids will not be accepted.
- 1.6 All applicable laws shall be deemed to be a part of these specifications and conditions. Any resulting contract will be read and enforced as though they were included.
- 1.7 The submission of a Bid shall serve as conclusive evidence that the CONTRACTOR has satisfied themselves with all requirements outlined in the Bid Specifications and to all conditions serving to control the execution of any contract which may ensue. The CONTRACTOR shall not at any time after the submission of his Bid, set up any claim whatsoever based upon insufficient data or incorrectly assumed conditions.
- 1.8 The Erie County Technical School Board will accept no more than one bid.
- 1.9 Within seven (7) days following the award of the Bid, the successful CONTRACTOR will enter into a written contract with the Erie County Technical School Board.
- 1.10 Each CONTRACTOR shall be prepared, if so requested, to present evidence of their experience, qualifications and financial ability to carry out the work in accordance with the terms of the agreement.
- 1.11 Each contract as referred to on the Bid Forms will begin upon the "Notice to Proceed" and will be completed no later than the date(s) specified herein.
- 1.12 Price must be fixed for 90 days from April 3, 2026.
- 1.13 Standard of Quality; the various materials and products specified in the specifications by name or description are given to establish a standard of quality and of cost for bid purposes. It is not the intent to limit the acceptance to any one material or product specified, but rather to name or describe it as the absolute minimum standard that is desired and acceptable. A material or product of lesser quality would not be acceptable. Where proprietary names are used, whether or not followed by the words "or as approved equal", they shall be subject to equals only as approved by the Erie

County Technical School representative described as the Owner throughout this specification. Any products other than those specified shall be considered alternates and should be marked accordingly on the bid form. Alternate bids will be accompanied with specifications regarding product quality, contents, and Right-to-Know Documentation. It is the sole responsibility of the Contractor / Bidder to include any and all documentation to attest to the Standard of Quality for equipment proposed and included in their Bid on or before the time of Bid opening stated herein.

SECTION II - GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 2.1 **SCOPE OF WORK:** The contractor shall provide all labor, tools, materials, supplies, equipment, transportation, and supervision necessary to perform the work as described herein. All work shall be conducted per this Statement of Work (SOW) and all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, codes and directives. This summary is not all-inclusive and delineates only those work items deemed as major to the contract. Additional work items not listed below, though necessary to attain the completed project, shall be included in the contract:

- 2.2 **NUMBER OF CONTRACTS:** It is the intent of the Erie County Technical School to enter into one contract for the materials and work necessary to complete the **Replacing the Auto Body Spray Booth** at the accepted location(s) as specified in the BID FORMS in Section V provided herein. The CONTRACTOR shall be deemed an independent CONTRACTOR and will not, during the term of the contract, or any renewals or extensions thereof, sell, assign, transfer, sublet or sublease all or any part thereof without the prior written consent of the Erie County Technical School; and should the CONTRACTOR become insolvent, or if proceedings in bankruptcy shall be instituted by or against the CONTRACTOR, the remaining or unexpired portion of the contract shall, at the election of the Erie County Technical School, be terminated.

2.3 **INDEMNIFICATION:**

A. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Erie County Technical School and its agents and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorney's fees arising out of or resulting from the performance of the Work, provided that any such claim, damages, loss or expense is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease or death, or to injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than the Work itself) including the loss of use resulting there from, and omission of the Contractor, any Subcontractor, anyone directly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, regardless of whether or not it is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or otherwise reduce any other right or obligation of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to any party or person described in this paragraph.

B. In any and all claims against the Erie County Technical School or any of its agents or employees by any employee of the Contractor, any Subcontractor, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, the indemnification obligation shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for the Contractor or any Subcontractor under workers or workmen's compensation acts, disability benefit acts or other employee benefit acts.

2.4 **INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS:**

A. The CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain at his own expense and without

expense to the Erie County Technical School, insurance for liability for damages imposed by law, of the kinds and in the amounts hereinafter provided, in insurance companies authorized to such business in the State of Pennsylvania covering all operations under the Contract whether performed by the CONTRACTOR or by his SUB-CONTRACTOR. Insurance shall remain in effect until final acceptance by the Erie County Technical School of the work covered by the contract. Each Insurance Company shall maintain an A.M. Best's A rating and Financial Size VII or better. Within five (5) days following the award of the Contract and before commencing the work, the CONTRACTOR shall furnish to the Erie County Technical School two "CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE" for each of the kinds of insurance hereinafter specified in the amounts specified in a form satisfactory to the Erie County Technical School showing that the CONTRACTOR has complied with this section, which policies and certificates shall provide that policies shall not be changed or canceled until thirty (30) days' written notice has been given to the Erie County Technical School. In case of ambiguity respecting a specific kind of insurance required, the paragraph setting forth the specified kind of insurance under question shall be endorsed upon the policy and certificates of insurance to show full coverage.

B. THE KINDS AND AMOUNTS OF INSURANCE ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1) **WORKER'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE:**

The Contractor must provide evidence of Worker's Compensation insurance, covering the obligation of the Contractor in accordance with the provisions of the Worker's Compensation Law, as amended, for all operations under the contract.

3) **CONTRACTOR'S AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY INSURANCE:**

Limit of Liability – per occurrence-	\$1,000,000
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PROOF OF INSURANCE: The contractor will have the limits of insurance as listed and will provide **Proof of Insurance** within seven days of "NOTICE TO PROCEED". Insurance will cover the contract period for the Scope of the Work to be performed. Work will not commence until **Proof of Insurance** has been obtained and provided to the Erie County Technical School.

- 2.5 **FAMILIARITY WITH CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS:** It is the responsibility of, and it is hereby agreed that the Contractor has, prior to signing of the Contract satisfied themselves as to the nature and location of the work, the conformation of the ground, any unusual conditions or situations, quality and quantity of materials which will be required, the character of equipment and facilities needed preliminary to and during the prosecution of the work, the general and local conditions and of all other matters which can in any way affect the Work. No oral agreement or conversation with any person, either before or after the execution of the Contract, shall affect or modify any of the terms or obligations of the Contract, which contains the entire agreement between the parties.
- 2.6 **EXPLANATION TO BIDDERS:**
- A. Each bid must give the full business address of the bidder and must be signed by them with their usual signature. Bids by partnership must furnish the full name of all partners and must be signed in the partnership name by one of the members of the partnership, or by an authorized representative, followed by the signature and designation of the person signing.
 - B. Bids by corporations must be signed with the legal name of the corporation, followed by the name of the State of incorporation, by the signature and designation of the president, secretary, or other person authorized to bind it in the matter. The name of each person signing shall also be typed or printed below the signature.
- 2.7 **RETAINAGE:** Retainage for the Project will be ten (10%) percent of the Bid amount, payable to the Contractor upon completion and acceptance of the work.
- 2.8 **MINIMUM WAGES:** This regulation and the general Pennsylvania prevailing minimum wage rates, Act. 422 of 1961, P.L. 987, Section 1-17 (43 P.S. 165, Section 1-17), with subsequent amendments thereto, where applicable, as determined by the Secretary of Labor and Industry, which shall be paid for each craft or classification of all workers needed to perform the contract during the anticipated term therefore in the locality in which public work is performed, are made a part of this specification. In complying with the requirements of these aforementioned laws, the Contractor should give attention to the provisions dealing with the submission and posting of certain specified forms and documents.
- 2.9 **CODES:** All construction work shall conform to all prevailing codes.
- 2.10 **ORDINANCES:** It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine what local ordinances, if any, will affect their work. They shall check for any county, city, borough, or township rules or regulations applicable to the area in which the project is being constructed and in addition, for any rules or regulations of other organizations having jurisdiction, such as chamber-of-commerce, planning commissions, industries, or utility companies who have jurisdiction over lands which the Contractor occupies. Any costs of compliance with local controls shall be included in the prices bid, even though documents of such local controlling agencies are not listed herein.
- 2.11 **STANDARD OF QUALITY:** The various materials and products specified in the specifications by name or description are given to establish a standard of quality and cost for bid purposes.

It is not the intent to limit the acceptance to any one material or product specified, but rather to name or describe it as the absolute minimum standard that is desired and acceptable. A material or product of lesser quality would not be acceptable. Where proprietary names are used, whether or not followed by the words "or as approved equal", they shall be subject to equals only as approved by the Architect/Engineer and/or Erie County Technical School representative. Any products other than those specified shall be considered alternates and should be marked accordingly on the bid form. Alternate bids will be accompanied with specifications regarding product quality, contents, and Right-to-Know Documentation.

- 2.12 **USE OF NAME BRANDS IN SPECIFICATIONS:** It is recognized there may be other brands that could serve the needs of the school system. However, it should be understood by the bidder that the use of brand names and numbers in the specifications is to establish minimum standards and styles of products that have been judged to meet the needs of the school system. Such use of brand names is in no way designed or intended to restrict the bidding. It is permissible to bid another brand, however, it is the responsibility of the Contractor to provide all submittals, documentation and proof that the alternate brands will seamlessly integrate with the existing system and meet or exceed the quality of products listed in the specifications herein.
- 2.13 **ALTERNATES:** Bidders shall bid only one product per item. Bidders shall not bid a primary item and then also include a second, alternate product item bid.
- 2.14 **BIDDER'S IDENTIFICATION OF PRODUCTS BID:** Should an alternate be bid, the bidder must insert the manufacturer's brand name and identifying numbers along with any other information necessary to identify sufficiently and completely the articles offered. Failure to do so may prevent consideration of the item bid. Bidders offering any article other than as specified must so state in each instance. Otherwise, their bid will be considered as being based upon furnishing the specific make, brand or manufacturer named in the bid. Catalogue cuts must accompany Vendor bids whenever an article is substituted for the one specified. This shall also apply where no specific brand is specified.

The Erie County Technical School will be the sole evaluator in determining item specification compliance and "alternate/or equal" conformance to acceptable quality standards for all bids submitted.

- 2.15 **SPECIAL NOTICE:** Bidders are required to inform themselves fully of the conditions relating to construction and labor under which the work will be, or is now being performed. The Contractor must employ, as far as possible, such methods and means in the carrying out of this work as will not cause any interruption or interference with any other Contractor.
- 2.16 **COMPETENT WORKMEN:** (Section 752, School Laws of Pennsylvania) When costs of the **total project** are less than or equal to \$25,000 the Contractor shall comply with the Competent workmen clause, as set forth in Section 752 of the School Laws of Pennsylvania. This states that no person shall be employed to do work under such contract except competent first-class workmen and mechanics. No workmen shall be regarded as competent and first class, within the meaning of the Act, except those who are duly skilled in their respective branches of labor, and who shall be paid not less than such rates of wages and for such hours work as shall be

established and current rates of wages paid for such hours by employers of organized labor in doing similar work in the Facility where work is being done.

- 2.17 **ACT 34 ACT 151 AND ACT 114 REQUIREMENTS:** It is the responsibility of the Contractor to familiarize themselves with Pennsylvania State Act 34, Act 151 and ACT 114. Pennsylvania Law requires that all employees of all contractors that will come in direct contact with any and all students must obtain an Act 34, Act 151, and Act 114 clearances. These Clearances are: The "CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES LAW – Act 151", The "SCHOOL CODE CRIMINAL HISTORY BACKGROUND CHECK-ACT 34" and The "FBI FINGERPRINT BACKGROUND CHECK"-ACT 114. These clearances are required to obtain a background check on ALL prospective contractors and their prospective employees to identify persons with child molestation/abuse convictions and/or criminal records. The CONTRACTOR, when necessary, will perform all such background checks and submit the same to the Erie County Technical School.
- 2.18 **DISCRIMINATION PROHIBITED:** According to 62 Pa.C.S.A. § 3701, the contractor agrees:
- A. That in the hiring of employees for the performance of work under this contract, or any subcontract hereunder, no contractor, sub-contractor, nor any person acting on behalf of such contractor or sub-contractor, shall, by reason of gender, race, creed or color, discriminate against any citizen of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania who is qualified and available to perform the work to which the employment relates.
 - B. That no contractor, sub-contractor, nor any person on their behalf, shall in any manner discriminate against or intimidate any employee hired for the performance of work under this contract on account of gender, race, creed or color;
 - C. That this contract may be canceled or terminated by the Erie County Technical School and all money due or to become due under the contract may be forfeited for a violation of the terms or conditions of that portion of the contract.
- 2.19 **HUMAN RELATIONS ACT:** The provisions of the Pennsylvania Human Relations Act 222 of October 27, 1955 (P.L. 744) (43 P.S., 951, et seq.) of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania prohibit discrimination because of race, color, religious creed, ancestry, age, sex, national origin, handicap or disability, by employers, employment agencies, labor organizations, contractors and others. The Contractor shall agree to comply with the provisions of this Act as amended that are made part of this specification. Your attention is directed to the language of the Commonwealth's non-discrimination clause in 16 PA. Code 49.101.
- 2.20 **TIME OF COMPLETION:** Each contract as referred to on the Bid Forms will begin upon "The Notice to Proceed" after the April 3, 2026 Board Meeting and will be completed no later than October 3, 2026.
- 2.21 **PROHIBITION ON CASH ALLOWANCES:** Cash allowances are prohibited.
- 2.22 **NO LIEN CONTRACT:** The Erie County Technical School will expect the successful Contractors and their Subcontractors to enter into a "NO LIEN CONTRACT."
- 2.23 **ACCESS TO ACCOUNTING RECORDS:** The Contractor shall check all materials, equipment

and labor entering into the Work and shall keep such full and detailed accounts as may be necessary for proper financial management under this Agreement, and the system shall be satisfactory to the Owner. The Owner or its representative shall be afforded access to all the Contractor's records, books, correspondence, instructions, drawings, receipts, vouchers, memoranda, and similar data relating to this Contract, and the Contractor shall preserve all such records for a period of three years, or for such longer period as may be required by law, after the final payment.

2.24 **CONTRACTS WITH SUBCONTRACTS:** The Contractor agrees to include "Access to Accounting Records" and "Assignment of Rights" paragraphs in any contracts with subcontractors.

SECTION III SCOPE OF WORK / SPECIFICATIONS

- 3.1 **SCOPE OF WORK:** Contractor will furnish all labor, materials, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete **Bid for Replacing the Auto Body Spray Booth** and will be completed at Erie County Technical School as described herein:
- 3.2 **MEASUREMENT OF AREAS:** Contractor is responsible for all conducting site visits and accessing all materials, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the **Bid for Replacing the Auto Body Spray Booth** for all areas shown on the site maps and marked in the specifications provided herein. The map(s) provided are to show location of existing spray paint booth. The Contractor is solely responsible for visiting the site location to verify all work needed to complete all work specified herein before submission of their Bid.
- 3.3 **WORK:** The Contractor shall survey, evaluate, determine and verify the existing conditions within designated project area. Verify the locations or all areas of work as described in the Specifications provided herein. Ensure that all site preparation is included for completion of all work specified.

A. **Demolish the existing spray booth:** Prior to installation of the new paint booth, the contractor will remove the existing paint booth structure and all ancillary items, and recycle and/or dispose of all associated waste in a manner which complies with all applicable federal, state, and local laws.

1. During the removal of the existing structure, care will be taken not to damage any associated electrical or pneumatic lines and connectors, so that these same lines and connectors may be used to supply the new paint booth.

B. **Furnish And Install New Paint Booth:** Once the existing paint booth has been removed, the contractor shall utilize all existing electrical, fire suppression, building air ducting, roof curbs and tops, and booth heating features as well as connecting the new system to all electrical, fire suppression, fire monitoring system(s), building ducting and heating. If the existing exhaust system cannot be utilized, the contractor shall be responsible for the removal and replacement of the unit, rerouting of the existing fire suppression line within the exhaust as well as repairs to the roof as applicable.

1. Specifications of new Paint Booth:

- a) Booth – 13'-6" wide, 27' long, 9' working height
- b) Modified downdraft or Downdraft
- c) Intake and exhaust fans (2)
- d) Forward curve centrifugal fan on intake
- e) 997k BTU direct fired burner with deluxe remote control
- f) 80% re-circulation in bake cycle
- g) 6 Hip 6-tube LED light fixtures, plenum mounted
- h) Dual 6-tube Lt fixture, 7 Lower 6-tube light fixtures
- 1) All interior serviceable and equipped with 5000k T-8 type LED tubes
- i) 10'-wide Tri-fold entry door
- j) Side service door facing center of room

- k) Dual skin insulated white powder-coated G90 wall panels
- l) 1- 8' observation window facing center of room
- m) 3 Cross-bar parts hangars
- n) 1 – 3 stage filter dryer assembly for compressed air
- o) Control Panel

C. The contractor is responsible for obtaining any necessary exemption letters and/or air permits for the construction and operation of the paint booth. The exemption letter and/or air permit must be obtained before any construction activities can begin.

D. The contractor shall be responsible for complying with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), Federal, and State health and safety requirements, which are applicable to this project. The Contractor shall use all means and precautions available to ensure the safety of the occupants and protection to the existing buildings and structures.

E. **General Items:** The following shall be provided as part of contract requirements in order to meet the specifications in the contract:

1. Manuals defining maintenance procedures (with parts listing), operational procedures, and troubleshooting procedures, and routine inspection procedures.
2. Complete demonstration of all start up and shut down, and additional components of paint booth.
3. Warranties: The contractor shall submit Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM) warranties of the equipment provided and include stipulations for maintaining warranty's validity. The contractor shall warrant all components free from defects in materials and workmanship under normal use and service for no less than one (1) year. The warranty period begins when installation is complete and accepted.

F. **Final Inspection and Acceptance:**

1. The acceptance test shall be conducted by the contractor's personnel and witnessed by a member of the Erie County Technical School designated representative. The booths will be examined for design, construction, materials, components, and workmanship to determine compliance with the contract and this specification. Any failure or deviation from the manufacturer specifications shall be cause for rejection.
2. Mechanical ventilation is required for a Walk-in Spray Paint Booth to remove paint particulates and solvent vapors from the corrosion facility. Upon facility completion, an independent ventilation expert must assess the mechanical ventilation system effectiveness. The ventilation expert shall provide a detailed ventilation system acceptance/discrepancy report.
3. The final acceptance of the ventilation system shall be determined by air sampling. In order to be acceptable, the ventilation system must control worker exposure to hexavalent chromium to below the action level of 2.5 micrograms per cubic meter of air (ug/m³) calculated as an 8-hour time-weighted average. If the testing results are unacceptable, the contractor shall

have fifteen (15) business days to satisfactorily demonstrate an acceptable, operational system at no additional cost to the Erie County Technical School.

G. Work Performance:

1. Contractor will familiarize themselves with the site prior to the start of work.
2. Contractor shall ensure all work is done and all equipment installed in accordance with manufacturer's specifications and guidelines.
3. Contractor shall follow a stringent clean-up plan (clean-as-you-go) to ensure no debris from construction/demolition or transportation of materials contaminates the facility or property.
4. The contractor will maintain a clean work area. Contractor will be responsible for removal and disposal of all used parts, supplies and material from the facility. Disposal shall be in accordance with Local, State, and Federal regulations. Contractor shall provide a dumpster for all debris or remove debris to an offsite location.
5. Electrical power and water are available on the site. The Contractor will be permitted to utilize these utilities in performing the work.
6. Restrooms will be available for use by the Contractor.

H. Standards: Contractor is responsible to obtain and abide by all referenced information to work performed.

1. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Applicable Standards as required
2. OSHA 1910.1026 – Chromium
3. UFC 3-600-01 Fire Protection Engineering for Facilities
4. NFPA 33 Standard for Spray Application Using Flammable or Combustible Materials.
5. American National Standards Institute (ANSI) Applicable Standards as required
6. American Institute of Steel Codes (AISC), standards, and specifications as required

I. Contractor Work Hours: All work required for breakdown and removal of existing booths, and installation of new booths shall be performed between the hours of 7:30 AM and 4:00 PM, Monday thru Friday, exclusive of Holidays and special closures. Other hours, weekend, and holiday work will be considered separately as requested by the contractor and approved by the Erie County Technical School.
